Institutional Report - 2022-24

1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF 33rd GOVERNING COUNCIL MEETING:

33rd Governing Council Meeting of Canara Engineering College (CEC), Sudhindra Nagar, Benjanapadavu, was held on 06-11-2023 at 11.00 am in the Board Room, of the institution.

Points discussed:

34.1. Approval of the 33rd G.C. MoM:

Minutes of the 33rd G.C. Meeting were approved with Sri. M. Ranganath Bhat proposing it and Sri. Vasudeva Kamath approving the same.

- 34.2. Implementation of Suggestions given by Governing Council Members in the last GC Meeting and action taken report was discussed. The Council appreciated actions initiated on the suggestions.
- 34.3. The GC members congratulated principal, faculty and staff for getting 'A' grade with 3.24 CGPA in NAAC accreditation.
- 34.4. They also acknowledged the efforts put in by the admission committee in getting good admission to the institution during 2023-24.
- 34.5. Appreciation was given for the results obtained during 2022-23 as they were also very encouraging.

- 31.4. Principal Secretary briefed on the significant achievements of the institution during the year 2022-23 after the Pandemic situation and challenges faced. then briefed on the agenda of the meeting proposing discussions on the same.

The meeting ended at 12.40 p.m.

2. ACTION TAKEN ON SUGGESTIONS GIVEN BY THE G. C. MEMBERS IN THE LAST MEETING:

1. In addition to improved admission, we should also aim to improve the placement record.

During 2023-24, out of 257 registered students, 103 students are placed via multiple on-campus recruitments so far. It is reduced marginally due to the global slowdown of recruitment of IT and ITES companies.

2. Facilities for students and faculty need to be more visible to improve the brand value.

During last 18 months, we have renovated the academic block, built the indoor sports facility, laid foundation stone for state-of-the-art auditorium with a seating capacity of 1500. Recently, New renovated labs have been inaugurated with all the required facilities. Transport facilities has been enhanced by procuring 8 No. new Ashok Leyland buses.

3. Encouragement should be given to students to begin 'Start-ups'.

Efforts are being made to create an ecosystem that encourages students to think of becoming entrepreneurs. IIC of the institution is conducting multiple events to motivate students towards this by inviting successful entrepreneurs. Alumni are also being engaged in this regard. Dr. Udaya Kumar K Shenoy is appointed as Dean (R&D) to work rigorously to create the required ecosystem.

4. Share the report a few days in advance to help us prepare for the meeting.

This will be done with priority.

5. Institution should aim towards becoming autonomous at the earliest as many institutions are getting the autonomous status and reaping the benefits.

Recently we have received the 2(f)-status certificate from UGC and we are eligible to apply for autonomous status. Dr. Udaya Kumar K Shenoy is assigned the job of applying for the autonomous status at the earliest. Since we are accredited with 'A' grade from NAAC we are eligible for 10 years of autonomous status.

6. Administrative and infrastructural strength of the institution should improve to manage the institution better after autonomous status.

To portray our facilities and commitment towards continuous improvement, a new exam block with all the necessary facilities is under construction. It is expected to be completed before April.

7. More labs with emerging technologies like AI, 3D printing should be set up to keep abreast with the fast-changing scenario.

Renovated Academic block with sufficient number of Classrooms, Labs, Faculty rooms, Skill lab, Indoor Sports center with all required software, furniture and other facilities have been built.

8. A proper strategic plan with specific targets and timeline should be developed.

The strategic plan is modified, and measures are being taken to fulfill the same within the stated timeline.

9. Measures to be taken to improve the Communication skills of students.

Efforts are being made continuously by training students to improve not just



communication skills, but also all types of soft skills. During 2023-24 more than 240 hours of combined training has been imparted to students of all 4 years.

10. More emphasis on improvement of student and faculty publication.

Continuous efforts are in place to improve the count and the quality of publication from both students and faculty. This year's proposal has been sent from **51 projects for KSCST funding**. And students are being encouraged to go for publication.

APPROVAL OF SEAT MATRIX FOR 2024-25

3. ADMISSIONS:

In order to stay abreast with the changing trends, 3 new branches namely AI & ML, CS & Design, CS & Business System were commenced from 2021-22. For the AY 2023-24 we have enhanced the intake of CSE from 150 to 180, ISE and AIML from 60 to 120. This makes the total sanctioned intake of 630 as against 480 during 2022-23. The SNQ quota stands at 34 seats.

Total admissions during 2023-24 is 625 as against the total intake of 664. Nine students have taken admissions to III semester via lateral entry. Currently, there are 1827 students studying in this institution from all branches and years.

B. Co-curricular activities:

Twenty-Two Tests on various FOSS were conducted for the 2nd and 3rd year students of ECE, CSE, ME, IS, AIML, CSD and CSBS branches. Following table provides the details of Spoken Tutorial Tests/NPTEL certificates conducted in the academic year 2022-23, during which, 916 students participated in Spoken tutorial certification program and 603 students secured certificates and 25 NPTEL certificates were obtained by staff and students.

13. STUDENT WELFARE ACTIVITIES:

















17. LIBRARY INFORMATION:

- The central Library of CEC is located in the heart of the institution and is easily accessible to its clientele. Having carpet area of 1305.68 mts, spread in 2 Floors. It can accommodate 300 users at a time. The collection of library is 47598 books including general Book bank books and SC/ST Book Bank which includes Text and Reference books, Competitive Examination books and general knowledge books, available for all round development of personality.
- The library subscribes 42 Indian Journals. We have access to more 11000+online journals that includes technical magazines and international journals, 16000+ E books, 7800 Abstracts Articles from various publishers subscribed packages under VTU Consortium. It is an Institutional Membership of National Digital Library and NDLI Club Sponsored by MHRD & designed by IIT Kharagpur. 7 Activities under NDLI are conducted during 2022-23.
